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### **Abstract**

One of the solutions to the gathering and sharing of the production generated by this brotherhood of nations goes beyond the visibility required y the knowledge allowing the construction of a virtual space specialized on the storage and dissemination of information – culminated with the creation of the ULAPSI Virtual Psychology Library. With the objective of promote the efficient, universal and equal access to the technical and scientific information sources the BVS ULAPSI has been consolidating itself as an effective alternative in organizing and disseminating the Psychology knowledge. Counting with 16 member nations while still expanding its reach. Founded by an ideology not only dedicated to the Latin America population of information consumers but also as information producers, the Psychology network aims to give visibility to the knowledge, promote the cross reference between regional authors and mainly promote the usage of the information as an instrument for improving the living standards.
